HORTICULTURAL AND INDUSTRIAL RULES

1. All Exhibitors paying £5 and over will receive one Ticket of Admission to the Show. Children under 16 years of age will be admitted on payment of 50p each, to exhibit in all Children's Classes free.
2. Exhibitors and Members of this Society will have to pay an entrance fee of 10p for each entry. ONE ENTRY PER CLASS.
3. Each Exhibitor, previous to placing any article for competition, shall sign a declaration that the productions exhibited for prizes are bona-fide their own growth, and that they have been in their possession at least two months previous to the day of the Show. Their garden must also be open for inspection by the Committee. If any Exhibitor does not conform to the declaration signed, or uses any deception with their flowers etc., the Committee, upon the facts being made known to them, shall have it in their power to withhold any prize that may have been awarded and such Exhibitor shall subject himself to expulsion. Any person objecting to any exhibit as not conforming to this Rule must state his objection in writing by 3:00 p.m. to the Secretary.
4. Competent judges will be appointed by the committee, and their decision shall in every case be final. Should the judges consider the best exhibit in any class unworthy of a prize, no prize will be awarded.
5. Exhibitors and their assistants only shall be allowed to enter the place of Exhibition during the time of setting up the flowers, etc. The Marquees will be opened for that purpose at 7:30 a.m. and all exhibits must be staged by 10:00 a.m. The tent will be open as soon as the judging is finished and closed at 4:45 p.m. Re-open at 5:00 p.m. when the exhibits may be removed.
6. Entry forms are available from the H & I Secretaries, the Show Office and online at www.glendaideshow.com The list of entries must be returned to the Secretary not later than the Wednesday before the Show.
7. Every care will be taken with the exhibits but the Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.
8. Once an exhibit has been staged it must not be removed to another class. A whistle will blow at 9:50 a.m. and at 10:00 a.m. to clear the tent.
9. Definition of a Novice a competitor who has not won a 1st prize at a previous show.

Points for Cup: 1st - 3; 2nd - 2; 3rd - 1

1 carton sunflower oil

2 level cartons sugar

3 level cartons self-raising flour

3 level cartons dry mixed fruit

3 eggs (medium)

Use an empty 125 ml yogurt carton to measure all the ingredients. This is a very easy cake to adapt to your own taste and a great way to use up left-over nuts and fruit. As long as you keep the quantities the same, you can use any fruit you like.

Measure all the ingredients into a bowl and combine into a soft mixture. Pour into a 2lb loaf tin. Cook in centre of a preheated oven for 1½ hours at 160°C (fan oven) gas mark 4. Check the cake is done by inserting a skewer. Allow to cool on a wire rack. Keeps well in a tin.

225 g self-raising flour **pinch of salt** **5 ml (1 tsp) ground ginger**
100 g caster sugar **75 g margarine** **100 g golden syrup** **1 medium egg, beaten**

Preheat oven to 180°C/Gas Mark 4. Grease some baking trays. Mix together the dry ingredients.

Warm the margarine and syrup, add to the dry ingredients with the beaten egg and mix well. Place teaspoons of the mixture on the baking trays and bake for about 15 minutes. Remove from the baking tray and cool on a wire rack.

½ tsp salt	85 g raisins	2 eggs, beaten	200 ml milk
75 ml vegetable oil	50 g muscovado sugar	5 tbsp clear honey	

Preheat oven to 200°C/fan oven 180°C//Gas Mark 6. Butter 8 holes in a muffin tin. In a large bowl, combine the flour, oats, baking powder, cinnamon, salt and raisins. In a separate bowl, mix together the eggs, milk, oil, sugar and honey. Stir this into the flour mixture until just combined, but don't overmix – the mixture should be quite runny. Spoon the mixture into the holes to fill. Bake for 20-25 minutes. Leave in the tin for a few minutes, then turn out on to a wire rack to cool.
